Remarks:

1. Applicant list above has been granted a full scholarship.
2. Applicant list above has been exempted from LC4003 Advanced integrated English language skills development and LC6000 Advanced reading and Writing in English for Graduated Studies.
3. Applicants listed above must register as new students for the academic year 1/2011, and enroll for classes in accordance with the following guidelines:
 - a. All applicants who have been admitted must register as new students for the academic year 1/2011(First Round), and enroll for classes at the Educational Service Division (Parking Building, 1st floor), NIDA, between **May 23rd -26th, 2011 (weekdays, 9.00 a.m.- 4.30 p.m.)**. If applicants can not come to pay for classes themselves, they can authorize another to do so. Representatives must bring an authorization letter and identification documents of both the applicant and the representative.
 - b. All applicants who have been admitted must pay registration and enrollment fees between **May 23rd -27th, 2011**. Payment can be made through at branches of the Kasikorn Bank, Bank of Ayudhya, Bangkok Bank, or Siam Commercial Bank.

- c. If payment has not been made between May 23rd -27th, 2011, applicants will be automatically dropped from the Institute's registration list.
- d. Students currently enrolled in other programs at NIDA must resign from those programs before they can register as Ph.D. students. Admitted applicants who have resigned from NIDA student status but who have not fulfilled the previously mentioned obligations do not qualify for Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) Program in Finance (International Program) registration.

Documents for Registration

Documents for registration and enrollment must be submitted between May 23rd -26th, 2011 (weekdays, 9.00 a.m. - 4.30 p.m.) at the Educational Service Division (Parking Building, 1st floor).

Please bring all documents for registration with you on the day that you collect the registration and enrollment forms

1. Bachelor's degree and Master's degree certificate (diploma) (two copies).
2. Bachelor's degree and Master's degree Official transcript (two copies).
3. Copy of personal identity card (two copies).
4. Graduates from institutes outside of Thailand must provide:
 - i) A Letter of Confirmation on Standard Curriculum for Bachelors' Degree obtained from the Ministry of University Affairs or the Civil Service Commission. Students should contact the Bureau of Standards and Evaluation at the Commission on Higher Education, Ministry of Education, (please see the registrar for assistance).
 - ii) For those who have not yet graduated, an official letter approved by their University Council clearly stating the graduation status of the applicant as of June 10th, 2011. The letter must be sent directly to:

Notes

- a) Applicants must submit documents i) and ii) above until June 10th, 2011.
- b) The University Council's approval letter of a master's degree must clearly state the date of graduation to be on or before June 10th, 2011.

c) Applicants who do not comply with the above deadline will be automatically dropped from the institute's registration list.

5. Official TOEFL or GMAT scores (one copy) (if applicable)
6. House Registration Certificate (Thai students only) (one copy)
7. Medical Certificate issued by a doctor (one copy)
8. Four photographs (1" each, not wearing graduation gown)
9. Evidence of any change of name, e.g. Marriage Certificate (two copies)

Note

- a) All photocopies must be signed and dated by the applicant.
- b) The Institute reserves the right to review all application documents at any time. Any applicant found to be unqualified for enrollment or who has failed to meet the necessary requirements will be dropped from the Institute's registration list.

Terms and Conditions for Scholarship Recipients

1. Recipients must maintain a 3.50 cumulative GPA for each semester to determine their eligibility for continued funding. Failures to meet the GPA requirement in any semester result in automatic forfeiture of the remainder of the scholarship.
2. Copyright in these shall be jointly owned by the student and the Institute for period of 5 years.
3. Recipients who interrupt their students will be immediately ineligible for their scholarships. Further, Upon their withdrawal from the program or their request for scholarship cancellation, recipients must refund the scholarship amount in full to the Institute, except that the Committee figures something else out.
4. The thesis must be published or at least the thesis-based paper or any part thereof must be accepted by and published in high-prestige and peer-review journals at the national or international level. These journals must be widely recognized in the field.
5. Recipients have no rights to apply for any scholarship provide by the Institute, except for the "state budget" financial aid supporting their research conduct and publication.
6. The award period will be 3 years.

Fees

1) Special activity fee	45,000 Baht per semester
2) Bank transaction fee	20 Baht per semester
3) Math Camp Course fee	9,500 Baht

The total fee for the first semester is 54,520 Baht. The institute will not refund any academic fees (including tuition fees and the activity fee) if the student resigns in the first semester.

Once students have enrolled, they must attend classes as specified in the schedule. In the first semester, students must maintain at least 9 credits.

Classes start on June 10th, 2011.
