

**Paper Develop Workshop  
at NIDA Business School  
January 10, 2020 (Friday)**

Emerging Markets Society (EMS) and NIDA Business School is pleased to invite applications for a paper development workshop (PDW) on **January 10, 2020 (Friday)** at NIDA Business School, National Institute of Development Administration (NIDA), Bangkok, Thailand.

The purpose of the PDW is to provide feedback to scholars and doctoral students on their research projects. Consistent with the mission of EMS, the objective of the PDW is to encourage scholars to do quality research on issues that are of relevance to emerging markets as well as the Asian region. The PDW will be divided into two sessions:

<b>Morning Session (Publishing Your Paper)</b>	<b>Afternoon Session (Paper Feedback)</b>
<p>The morning session will provide participants with the opportunity to learn about the publishing process, including the revise and resubmit process. You will hear from journal editors and experience reviewers on the tricks to getting your papers accepted in reputable journals.</p> <p>This morning session is open to everyone, but advanced seat reservations are required. We encourage authors to submit their original work which can be either full length papers or idea papers. Full length papers should not be more than 10,000 words in length, while paper ideas should not be more than 2500 words in length.</p> <p>The space for this afternoon session is <b>limited to 20 papers</b>. Please make your submissions to <a href="mailto:nbs-phd@nida.ac.th">nbs-phd@nida.ac.th</a> by November 25, 2019. We will make the final decisions and inform the authors by the first week of December 2019.</p>
